ICT

As many parents will know, Paul Forrow has been working with children in Class 2 since January, and many of you have asked him about this. As a result of your interest, Paul has asked for the following item to be included in the Newsletter.











As you may be aware, I've been teaching computer programming to the class 2 children over the last term. For those who don't know me, I moved to Malham in summer 2015 and my son Edward is in reception at Kirkby Malham. I work for Barclays, who are very keen to support community initiatives. My work involves a lot of computer programming, so it seemed natural to help out with this at school.

Those who attended the celebration assembly before Easter will have seen some of the computer programs which the children have built, and seen the enthusiasm generated. The children are a pleasure to teach, very engaged, and keen to keep learning. I've had several requests from parents for more information so that parents can understand more, and perhaps get involved from home.

We've been using a simple online programming language called Scratch. It's very visual, and is designed to be accessible and quick to learn. You don't need to download anything - you can do it all from a web browser (e.g. Chrome or Safari). The easiest way to get started is to read the online material:

- 3. https://scratch.mit.edu/projects/editor/?tip_bar=getStarted gives a simple step-by-step guide to get started

For the more old-school (!), there are also some good books available, for example 'Coding for Beginners Using Scratch' (£4 on Amazon).

As you saw in the celebration assembly, last term we focussed on making a simple quiz based on work topics such as 'Land of the Free' and 'The Great Barrier Reef'. This term we'll be looking at making a simple computer game. In each case, I've put together some examples which we'll use, and you're welcome to take a look. You can see them by searching for 'PaulForrow' in Search bar at the top of the the <u>Scratch website</u>, and then clicking on the examples (e.g. 'Simple Quiz').
